Key Club Hierarchy

International - Key Club International is led by the international Board, which is comprised of the international president, international vice president, international vice president and 11 international trustees, all students and active key club members.



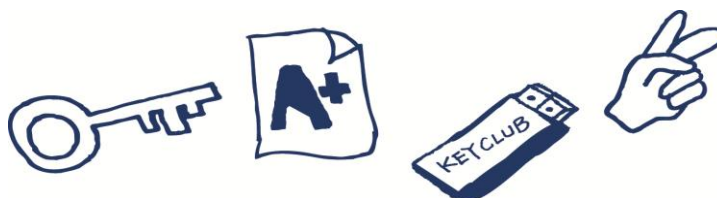
District- A district is sometimes defined by state or nation, and tends to match a similar Kiwanis district. Each district is chaired by a governor, elected by delegates at the annual district convention.



Division- Each district is divided into territories called divisions, made up of various clubs. Each Lieutenant governor, a student leader who carries out the district policies and provides support to the clubs.



Club- Key clubs are established in a high school. Elected officers can include president, one or more vice presidents, secretary, treasurer, editor and one director from each class.
